IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Entries are available via Nominate.

This event will be run under PCASA rules. Rules are available on the PCASA website: www.ponyclub.asn.au. It is the responsibility of every competitor to be aware of these rules.

Pony Club riders must have a performance card to ride.

All performance cards must be current & up to date. Cards must be presented when collecting body numbers. All Club combinations must have a Graded card and have 4 qualifications on the card to compete.

EA Riders must provide a completed EA Rider Waiver to ride. This can be emailed to whpc.entries@gmail.com prior to the 26th or a printed copy can be handed into the sign in desk on the day.

Riders must supply their own body number holder. A4 body number holders must be worn for the XC phase of the competition. Bridle number holders may be used for Dressage & Show jumping phases.

Pony Club riders must wear full uniform for dressage, show jumping and presentations. Club polos may be worn for cross country. Dress for PCASA and EA riders: as per Pony Club rules. Medical armbands and approved safety vests must be worn on cross-country.

Riders who do not present to an arena or start having been twice called to start their competition will be given a 5-minute warning. If at the end of that time they do not attend they will be eliminated.

Approved helmets with current PCASA helmet tags, riding boots and equipment must be worn.

In the event of a rider fall, riders will be eliminated. All rider falls must be assessed and reported by the event medical personnel.

Refunds will only be given for withdrawals before the close of entries, unless a veterinary or medical certificate is produced.

Competitors may ride a maximum of 1 horse per grade over the competition.

There are compulsory gear checks before each phase in all classes.

The organising committee reserves the right to ballot out entries if numbers warrant, to divide classes if necessary and refuse entries with or without stating reasons.

The cross-country course will be open from approximately noon on the 26/10/2024.

All protests must be lodged in writing accompanied by \$50 within 30 minutes of results being posted.

No smoking or alcohol allowed on the grounds.





No dogs allowed at event.

Camping: yards are reserved during the day for Williamstown H&PC members but will be available overnight for campers.

All placegetters to present in official riding uniform or riding wear for presentations.

Prizes will only be presented to place getters who attend the presentation phase of the event.

Any place getters wishing to leave before presentations will have chosen to forfeit their prizes.

Points will still be allocated to relevant place getters. Place getters cards will not be returned until after presentations. The organising committee will endeavour to hold presentations as soon as possible after the last rider has competed.

Horses being kept in temporary yards must set up only in designated areas. This is for your horse's safety. Temporary yards are those made of rope or electric tape.
